Programs and Coaching

StarSkate Program

StarSkate encourages skaters to develop more advanced figure skating skills in various areas such as Skating Skills, Free Skate, Dance and Artistic Skating. The program challenges skaters in a competitive environment through competition and encourages skaters to keep participating in skating for fun, fitness and achievement.

Skating Skills: Skaters learn exercises containing edges, turns and field movements executed on a pattern.

Free Skate: Skaters learn how to execute jumps, to spin in a variety of positions and to incorporate those and other skills into a program of a specified length using connecting steps and music interpretation.

Artistic: Encourages creativity and movement to music, and allows skaters to explore the performance aspect of skating without focusing on technical elements.

Dance: Skaters learn timing, musicality, rhythm, interpretation, and structure as well as basic skating skills such as edges, flow, control and unison. Each compulsory dance has a series of steps that must be skated in a specific pattern.

Team Coaching Model

Team coaching means that all of our StarSkate coaches will collaborate to plan and direct your skaters' development in all areas. All coaches will make decisions and be involved in lesson planning and direction.

Skaters have been assigned a coach contact. This coach is your main point of communication for your skater's programming and other skating related questions. For example, questions about competition registration, upcoming assessments, new skates, etc.

Private Lessons

Private lesson fees range from \$12 to \$14 for a 15 minute private lesson. Semi-private and small group lesson rates are prorated to reflect the number of skaters in the lesson.

The coaching team has drafted a private/semi-private lesson schedule. Your Contact Coach will let you know when your skater's lessons take place. Your skater can expect to receive one private lesson per week and a semi-private/small group lesson every other day they skate.

Skater Etiquette

Skaters are expected to arrive for skating on time, wearing form fitted clothing, jackets without a hood, hair tied back, and a water bottle at the boards. Please remind your skater to use the bathroom before skating as we often have skaters asking to leave the ice during a session.

Assessments and Competitions

Assessments: Star 1-5 assessments are led by a coach on a regular skating session. Your skater's contact coach will let you know when your skater is ready for an assessment.

- Assessments require a 15 minute private lesson, which will be reflected on the coaches invoice. The private lesson fee is in addition to the \$15 Skate Canada assessment fee.
- The Skate Canada assessment fee is paid online through the AESC website located under Quick Links, registration, StarSkate and purchase products.
